SM21 – The Power of Rhythm, Grades 2+, limit: 20

An exploration of rhythm and drumming using a guided, interactive drum circle. Participants will collaborate together on a variety of instruments and will have a chance to spontaneously create music and develop rhythmic ideas within a supportive community atmosphere. Drums and percussion instruments will be provided and no previous musical experience is required.

VA01 - A Little of This, A Little of That... Pre-K – Grade 2, no limit

Multi stations will be set up for our children age 7 and younger to try their hand at being creative with several different types of materials.

Session 1: Try Origami 3D art; design a tile, make a jingle stick; and let's bring out the watercolors.

Session 2: Let your imagination fly; try your hand at hat making using everyday items; bring in the color; experiment with chalk.

(Child must be accompanied by an adult.)

VA31 - Draw-A-Lot (Grades 3+, limit: 30)

Work in a real drawing studio exploring the effects of light, space and shadow. Learn the methods to produce dark to light gradations

and learn the language of line. Discuss what is needed for a great drawing portfolio. Take home your work to begin!

VA32 - 3D Clay Exploration, Grades 3+, limit: 30

Location: Clay studio on Oakland Avenue.

Make a three dimensional object in clay. Techniques in making will be featured. Limited time means artwork will not be fired. Your art work will be wet and fragile, so bring a shoe box and packing materials to safely transport it home. We encourage you to take photos.

VA33 – Fun in the Sun – Solar Printing, Grades 3+ limit 20

Instructor: Professor Johnny Power
Location: Millikin Quad

Make a fun image using the light of the sun. We will use flat materials placed onto specially coated paper to create a blue image. This process has been used since the late 19th Century as a means of making a permanent image on paper. Students will use organic materials such as leaves and sticks, cut out paper or drawing on acetate as a means of creating their image. The prints will be washed in water to reveal the image. Students will be able to take home their fun sun print. No materials are required.

VA34 – Communicate With Arts Technology, Grades 3+, limit: 30

Location: Blackburn MacLab – Middle of Campus.
