PA01 – Make A Dance!, All Ages, limit: 16

SCHOOL OF MUSIC

SM01 – Music Creation Station, Pre-K – Grade 2, limit: 20

Join Millikin Music Education students on a musical journey. Make an instrument to take home, experiment using classroom instruments,

and use Orff Instruments to help tell a favorite childhood story. No musical training is required.

SM31 – Composition ABC's, Grades 3 – 6, limit 20

Take the first steps in composition using classroom instruments and familiar household items. Participants will experience the artistic processes of creation, performance, and responding to music. Classroom instruments will be provided such as drums, xylophones, etc. No musical training is required.

SM61 – RAP: Musical Storytelling, Grades 6 – 12, limit: 20

Using a sample piece of music, participants to identify the key elements of rap music and break down typical stereotypes associated with rap music.
