Each constituent association shall include in its bylaws provisions corresponding to the provisions of such of these bylaws as are identified by the number symbol (#). Section 7. The designation of the number symbol (#) to any article or section of the bylaws of a local PTA/PTSA unit or council shall be considered an amendment and shall follow the process of this article. Section 8.
	Section 8. All changes to any article or section of the bylaws of a local PTA/PTSA unit or council designated with the number symbol (#) shall be considered an amendment and shall follow the process of this article.
